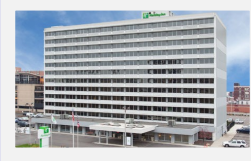

The United Methodist Free Store opened in 1999 on the urban south side of Columbus, Ohio. This action reflection approach begins Saturday afternoon, includes Sunday worship, plus several opportunities to engage the community in discussions and common meals.



Presentations, workshops and the ministry practicum are designed to address your next steps to develop intentional relationships with those on the margins, developing a multi-cultural, multi-class faith community and transform the community in which you serve.
